Brief description of proposed charter amendment:

The City and County of Honolulu should move all core parking functions into the Department of Enterprise Services which is a Department that can manage all core parking functions. Like most cities, parking facilities should be managed by one entity for operational financial efficiencies. The Department of Enterprise Services should have the parking function since it is revenue generating. By consolidating it into one entity, the City can manage that function properly.

Purpose of the proposed amendment:

To create an efficient, parking planning, operations and management by moving all parking core functions into the existing City's revenue generating entity that can be self-sustaining and fund parking-related or other community benefits within the communities that the revenue is generated.

The issue or problem to be addressed by the proposal:

All aspects of parking core functions (employee parking, public parking, attendant parking, on-street parking, off-street parking, etc;) within the City and County of Honolulu are distributed among several agencies, the City Department of: Transportation Services (DTS); Enterprise Services (DES), Parks and Recreation (DPR), Honolulu Police Department (HPD), Facility Maintenance (DFM), Budget and Fiscal Services (BFS), Corporation Counsel (COR); and many others. These functions, according to the Honolulu Urban Core Parking Master Plan by Walker Parking Consultants, the functions are spread among five departments and should be consolidated into one entity. Currently, one needs to call various agencies to obtain parking information: (for example, city employee/motorpool parking, DFM; Blaisdell/Zoo parking DES; on-street citations, meters

(HPD), parking revenue BFS, parking refunds, COR, Hanauma Bay/golf course parking (DPR), etc.

On-street parking functions could remain with DTS but should be consolidated into one agency. Off-street parking functions and revenue generation should all remain with one sole entity to avoid public confusion and greater efficiency and better management. Although citations revenue resides with the State, the City enforces the parking meters and parking facilities using employee staff, or contracted third party operators and concessions for off-street parking lots. The entity, DES, could have its own parking planning, facilities/equipment/maintenance, enforcement, and other divisions/branches to make it an entire self-sustaining entity with persons to address all aspects of parking facilities planning, operations and management.
